10. 科目内容・授業計画	<p>In an increasingly globalized world it is imperative for students to understand not only different points of view, but also how different conclusions may be reached on the same subject. This course will develop global thinking skills by introducing students to the theory of knowledge and epistemology in International Relations (IR). Students will first explore ideologies and philosophies that shape our perceptions of local and global issues, in order to learn how to deconstruct reality to better understand and analyze situations.
